We do not formally assess you in any part of the programme of study, unless there is a specific requirement from your home college or University for us to award you marks. Please tell us if you require assessments/marks BEFORE you arrive in Birmingham. Not all modules are available for assessments/marks so it is very important that you tell us if you need assessments/marks in your learning agreement before you travel to the UK.
	Please note: If English is not your first language and you are from outside the European Union, you will need minimum of IELTS 5.5 in order to take modules with assessment/marks.
Erasmus+	Please send us your Learning Agreement when you submit your Application Form and Audition/Portfolio.
All other Exchanges	We will arrange your Learning Agreement only once you have been accepted to study at Birmingham Conservatoire.

Estimated Cost of Living:

Living costs will vary depending on lifestyle but it is generally cheaper to live in Birmingham than other UK cities, such as London or Edinburgh. Here is a breakdown of some general expenses for you to consider when preparing your finances:

University accommodation (52 weeks)	From £3,510 to £6,426
Food, and other shopping	£2,600
Insurance for personal belongings	£15 - £117
Laundry (using a laundrette)	£240
Course related costs: books/stationery/photocopying/binding	£450
Bus pass – 3 terms + summer pass (travel)	£390
Mobile telephone	£240
Social activity costs – depends on activities	£600 - £960
Kitchen utensils, plates and cutlery	£35
Police registration (if applicable)	£34
