Through field study across various disciplines, the course examines the contemporary sustainability issues faced by major cities. Students will gain experiential learning in the application of the current theories, models and methods used in engineering, architecture and urban planning to specific, real-world issues of sustainable urbanism as they are currently being addressed in rapidly changing cities in China.
